

**WIN THE LOST**

**Why do we need to share the Gospel?**

**Today's Manna**

*(1 Corinthians 9:22-23) 'To the weak I became as weak, that I might win the weak. I have become all things to all men, that I might by all means save some. Now this I do for the gospel's sake.'*

One of the first things that happen to us when we are born again is the discovery that God has placed His love in our hearts for the lost. This love often turns mild mannered men and women into courageous evangelists and missionaries who defy huge risks and challenges to cross oceans and venture into unknown lands, to bring the gospel to those who are heading into a Christ-less eternity. This love is so powerful that it enabled us to love our enemies and turn us into people who are willing to sacrifice our possessions even our life for the sake of bringing the gospel to those who do not know Jesus like the Apostle Paul of old.

## **1. We have the mandate**

When God saves us, He turns our hitherto self-centred lives into lives of significance by giving us an eternal and global mandate. The church and its various ministries exist to equip, empower and encourage every believer to carry out this divine mandate to reach the lost.


*'Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.'* (Matthew 28:18-20)

## **2. We have the power**

The Holy Spirit empowers us with divine power to be effective evangelists. He will give us the right words to say as we are moved by the Holy Spirit to step out in faith to share the gospel or pray for the sick. Peter was fearful and weak in faith but after the Holy Spirit came upon him, he became bold and his Holy Spirit inspired testimony brought strong conviction on the hearers and 3000 people came to know the Lord.

*'But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.'* (Acts 1:8)

I hope New Life folks will let the **Great Commission** guide us in everything that we do personally and collectively as a cell group. Our trips, our gatherings etc can be **pre-evangelistic** as we use them to build bridges into the lives of our friends and loved ones.



Pre-E activities are very important as they help break down walls and defences that the enemy has erected in the lives of pre-believers through ignorance (e.g. 'It's a western religion'); negative experiences (e.g. I was hurt by the words from this person who claimed to be a

Christian) and misunderstandings (e.g. 'Christians don't honour their ancestors!') with Christianity.

Showing that we **care** for them and not just to convert them; giving a testimony of God's goodness at the appropriate time and living a life blessed by God are effective ways for the light of the gospel to shine into their lives. All our activities take on new, eternal significance and purpose as we do it unto the Lord to win the lost.

## *My Reflections*

1. Many Christians suffer from a lack of confidence in sharing the gospel because they feel that they are not spiritually mature or knowledgeable enough. While we should take the initiative to equip ourselves by study, attending Christian seminars etc our primary confidence should be in the Holy Spirit who empowers us to be His witnesses. He has promised to give us the anointed words to speak at the right time.

On a scale of 1 to 10, how is your confidence level in sharing the gospel? What will increase that confidence? Share what resources have helped you in equipping yourself to share the good news.

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2. In the Bible, we read:

*(1 Corinthians 9:22-23) To the weak I became weak, to win the weak. I have become all things to all people so that by all possible means I might save some. I do all this for the sake of the gospel, that I may share in its blessings.*

*(1 John 3:18) Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth.*

The above scriptures tell us the determination and sacrifices of Apostle Paul and Saint John in sharing the gospel and the love of God. Discuss how this scripture can apply to our lives and in our sharing of the gospel with others.

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3. List the names that you have been praying for salvation. Add two (2) new names to the list today. START your prayer with the following scripture. Commit to pray until they receive salvation.

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**CARE TO TALK?**


*(John 4:7) When a Samaritan woman came to draw water, Jesus said to her, "Will you give me a drink?"*

An age old social phenomenon, which might have gotten worse in spite of our present social networking age, is 'being lonely in a crowd'. We are at a loss for words when it matters the most, i.e. when we need to relate to others meaningfully, in person.

Sometimes, as church going Christians, we could have inadvertently limited ourselves to talking only to people like ourselves. But Jesus, the Word of God broke all human social taboos during His day. As a Jew, He went intentionally to talk to his 'enemies', in this case a Samaritan woman. And the result was an incredible forerunner to the Samaritan Revival in Acts Chapter 8.

1. Hence, for those of us who find it hard to relate, we could at least learn from Jesus: take a special interest in another; make time; ask a harmless question; present a simple request etc., put it simply, learn the lost art of making meaningful conversation towards making a friend out of someone who hitherto could be hostile to us, but this is that someone the Lord has placed in our hearts to reach out to.

2. Practise our conversion testimony which should include some simple Gospel presentations. This might help this person to pray a prayer meaningfully to receive God into their lives. Some of these include: the Bridge to Eternal Life, the Romans Road, the ABC's of Salvation, the Four Spiritual Laws, John 3 : 16 etc

3. And, finally, learn when to **stop talking** and let our actions do the talking, i.e., when we, with our obedient actions, co-operate with the Holy Spirit, who alone will

convict all people of sin, righteousness and judgment to come. ( John 16:8 )

### Today's Manna

*(Matthew 10:39) Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it.*

Matthew 10:39 has been the anchor for my faith when it comes to the area of evangelism. It clearly states how far we are expected to go for the sake of the Gospel. While I don't think everyone should just die for the Gospel, the only way to gain life, is to let go of our life for Jesus' sake.

### **The extreme Price to pay in order to share the Gospel**

In 2007, a group of 23 Korean missionaries were held hostage



by the Taliban in Afghanistan. While being captured, two of the members were executed. One of them was Bae Hyung-Kyu (a 42-year old pastor) who was leading the team. He volunteered to be executed before the rest because he told the rest of

the young missionaries that they still had many years of life ahead of them to live for Christ.

What an inspiring story! We have to understand that **sharing the gospel is not about meeting a sales target or a religious responsibility** that weighs us down. It is an effort that has to be initiated by the Lord. We can't preach the Gospel without the leading and help from the Holy Spirit. Our desire to share the Gospel has to be the result of the infilling of the Holy Spirit upon our lives.

***But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth. (Acts 1:8)***

### **Reaping Harvest from responding to God's invitation**



Back in 2006, together with some youth members, we were given the opportunity to teach about Christianity in a government-funded project. It was a risk but we were convinced that it was an opportunity to share the Gospel. Since then, we have been

faithfully conducting the class weekly. Through this ministry, we have connected with more than 700 young people from all around Malaysia and more than 15% of them have come to know the Lord.

It was an invitation from the Lord. We responded. We stepped out of our comfort zone and the Lord showed us the result.

The Apostle Paul testified of his triumph in Christ when the church at Thessalonica was established at his preaching of the Gospel: ***“You know how badly we had been treated at Philippi just before we came to you and how much we suffered there. Yet our God gave us the courage to declare his Good News to you boldly, in spite of great opposition. (1 Thessalonians 2:2)***

While the Great Commission has called the Church universal to make disciples of all nations, let us keep pace with the Lord’s heart, have a clear understanding that as we step out in obedience, the Holy Spirit will guide and lead us. Despite the hardship and the price to pay, we can be bold and strong, just like the Apostle Paul and the clouds of witnesses throughout the ages.

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**SHINE FORTH YOUR LIGHT**

**Today's Manna**

*(Matthew 5:14-16) 'You are the light of the world, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven.'*

**Witness through words and deeds**

I have met very few who have not heard of the Gospel at all. Most of them have, in one way or another, at some points in their lives. What God wants us to do is not just **to share the Gospel but also to live it out**. You are the light of the world. Light is not meant to be kept but to shine forth Christ's gospel of love and truth through us. One of the most powerful means of evangelism is **a life yielded to God's transforming love and a life of service**.

I was the first in my family to believe when I was in Form Four . Initially, my parents were against it as they wanted me to focus

more on my studies than church activities. Later, they changed their minds as they saw me changed from an impatient, vulgar young man into a better soul. They even encouraged me to bring my younger brother (who was more hot-headed than I) along. My brother came under the power of the Holy Spirit and gave his life to Jesus in a youth camp the following year. Both of us experienced not just the transforming power of God but also His rich favor and blessings. My parents not just heard but experienced the Gospel through our transformed lives. Both of them accepted the Lord three years later.


### **Witness through God's dealings in our lives**

The other thing we need to do is to share our lives' struggles and victories with the needy. People naturally experience frustration, hopelessness and anger as they endure life's hardships. They need breakthroughs. God has blessed us with many supernatural breakthroughs and provisions. We need to help others experience the same. The challenge is to lay down our lives to serve others.

My wife was very weak when she was going through her confinement period after the birth of our second child. She heard that her sister-in-law was warded in a private clinic due to suspected liver poisoning. When we visited her, her condition got worse. The doctors pronounced a grave prognosis that her liver was poisoned beyond repair. She was given only a few more days to live. She was only in her mid-20s and had a 6-month old baby. All the family members were very

sad and were at her death bed awaiting her departure. Her stomach bulged up like a pregnant lady, her lips were pale and she was getting unconscious as the days passed by. When we visited her, she was already slipping into unconsciousness.

We were praying for God's breakthrough whilst we were on the way and had a vision that an angel of God gave her a new liver. My wife told her sister-in-law that Jesus wanted to heal her and asked if she would accept Him as her Lord and Saviour. As

she was so weak, my wife asked her to squeeze her hand gently if she agreed. She did. My wife led her in praying the sinner's prayer and rebuked the sickness in Jesus' name. All of a sudden, her sister-in-law sat up, to everyone's amazement. Her lips were red again. She asked for food as she was hungry. All the unbelieving family members were utterly amazed and could only praise God for her miraculous turnaround. My wife, though feeble in her own condition, was at the hospital daily to help pray for her sister-in-law's full recovery.

***The most appropriate time to minister is usually the most inconvenient time*** for us. But if we lay down our lives, just like

Christ laid down His, we will help others to experience their supernatural breakthroughs and blessings. Church leaders may not be able to be there all the time for all the needy. But if all of us would be willing to step in to fill the gap, our God, who works through our leaders, will also work through us! Amen!

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## EVANGELISM IN THE MARKETPLACE

*(1 Corinthians 4:2) 'Now, a person who is put in charge as a manager must be faithful.'*


#### **Why am I placed in this place of work?**

It has always been said that we need to see the big picture. We are afraid to be seen as petty and small minded if we focus only on the small things, and be accused of not being able 'to see the forest for the trees'. We dare not 'sweat the small things'.

It is a myth. If you don't get the small pictures right, the big picture will never be right. It's alright to have a big vision. But if the details are not in place, it will be confusion instead.

Evangelism is about doing the small things. It's not about a big stage, speaking to a big crowd, nor about a big moment. It is about sharing how the message of hope has touched your life - a solitary life in a world of 7,000,000,000.

“...take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.’... ‘I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me.’(Matthew 25:34-40)



*It's therefore important that people can see the love of Christ in and through our lives, daily, consistently and in all circumstances.*

Evangelism is about sharing Jesus in practical ways, one soul at a time. Sometimes it's with a glass of cold water, with a meal, with words of prayer. It's not always about preaching and sharing scriptures, although at God inspired moments, these too can work breakthroughs. And

as we spent most of our days in the workplace, would it not be that - sharing the life of Christ, is the reason why we are placed there?

**Never underestimate the need to lend a listening ear.** Always remember, these may be the small things we are called upon to do, but to those in need, they are big moments. We will never know when it matters most, but we know we just need

to be faithful in doing them. Their needs may not be immediate. They may not even be the one who needs help but someone they know. But do they know who they can talk to when the time comes?

### **The importance of our Christian witness**

*‘By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another.’ (John 13:35)*

Before we accepted the Lord, we were searching for a Sunday school for our son. One of the persons we spoke with was an old friend of mine; ‘old’ because we had not been in touch for a long time. I think we met up less than three times in more than 20 years, and that was for work! But I remembered him because he had **shared** with me many years ago, and also because he **cared**.

It’s therefore important that **people can see the love of Christ in and through our lives**, daily, consistently and in all circumstances.

Today's Manna

*(John 9:25) 'One thing I do know. I was blind but now I see!'*

‘How did someone like me become a Christian? How were others used by the Lord to touch my life?’

This chapter is for us to share our own story out of a **grateful** heart.

When it comes to the conception of our ‘Christian Life’, many Christians would say that we ‘found God’, ‘received Jesus’, ‘accepted Christ’ or in similar Church-ianese phrases. What it really means is that we each have made some **choices** to become a Christian.

So, what are the extenuating human factors that would promote pre-believers (which we once were) in making a ‘yes’ response to become a Christian? And conversely, what are

those human behaviors that might turn them ‘off’ from wanting to be ‘born again’? (John 1:12-13)

**So where do we stand as far as wanting to work with the Holy Spirit in helping a pre-believer take that bold step, make that CHOICE to be BORN AGAIN ?**

As I recalled, what turned me off from becoming a Christian included:

1. That classmate that always irritated me, yet went to church every week.
2. When during a casual visit to a church service (just to check them out), why those church people did not share their ‘meal’ (I now know it was called ‘communion’) with me when they know full well I was a visitor ? My Dad would share his cup of kopi-susu at coffee shop with children he hardly knew !
3. Being cornered in University Malaya campus by a stranger who insisted on ‘sharing the four spiritual laws’ until all I could remember was the drops of sweat on his tan and glistening forehead.
4. Being cornered again, and having to listen to a long monologue which only ended with ‘do you want to become a Christian now?’, what was my reply? You guessed it.

What changed all that?

1. Christians who met me at Melbourne Tullamarine airport and provided me with temporary lodging for a week, when my relative was too busy to come meet me at the airport.
2. While alone in a strange land and strange place (a 'Christian flat', 64, Gatehouse Street, I think), I actually picked up a 'four spiritual laws' booklet, read it aloud, including the 'sinner's prayer' and actually meant it, this time.
3. A college mate who was kind enough to invite me to stay with him.
4. Two Christians down the street that invited us to church and provided transport.
5. That flat mate agreed to go to church and said something like: 'since you got nothing to do, come along lah'.

That was how I got to church and the Holy Spirit took over from there, I guess.

So, it appears that all those Christians that I bumped into, all have contributed one way or other to allow me make that all important 'born again' decision by praying 'the sinner's prayer', in my case. And I am grateful for all of them.

P/s That formerly irritating classmate turned out to be one of my great friends eventually. I now know that communion 'meal' is not to be taken lightly. And my college mate and all those welcoming friends have turned out to be God's men of the hour. And as a case of poetic justice, now I find myself in those very same shoes of those Christians that once turned me off Christianity, HELP me God !!!!! You can sympathise with me if I am still learning to rejoice when people do not seem to respond gladly to my Christian witness. :p God's a good scriptwriter with a wicked sense of humour, so it seems.

## **A**cts of the Holy Spirit

We believe that permanent change can only come when a person encounters God and be transformed by the power of the Holy Spirit. It is our desire that the Holy Spirit be given prominence in all our services and gatherings and we pray that He will powerfully touch lives and perform miracles through us.

## **B**lessing one another

Like the lyrics of one of the praise songs, we desire to be a people who are ‘so blessed that we cannot contain it’. We start by blessing one another at the end of every Sunday service where we hold hands and bless the persons to our right and our left. Holding hands helps to break down emotional walls and is also a prophetic sign of synergy and unity that commands God’s blessings upon the church.

(Genesis 12:2-3) “I will make you into a great nation. I will bless you and make you famous, and you will be a blessing to others. I will bless those who bless you and curse those who

treat you with contempt. All the families on earth will be blessed through you."

(Psalm 133:1-3) How wonderful and pleasant it is when brothers live together in harmony! For harmony is as precious as the anointing oil that was poured over Aaron's head, that ran down his beard and onto the border of his robe. Harmony is as refreshing as the dew from Mount Hermon that falls on the mountains of Zion. And there the Lord has pronounced His blessing, even life everlasting.

## onfessions of God's word

Faith is birthed by the Holy Spirit in our hearts and confessions of our lips will release it into being/reality.

"For it is by believing in your heart that you are made right with God, and it is by confessing with your mouth that you are saved." (Romans 10:10)

God formed the world through proclamations of faith (Read Genesis 1:1-3).

As the Holy Spirit hovers over the formless earth in the beginning, we believe in the hovering presence of the Holy Spirit over every gathering. He will put God's will and desire in our hearts and we are to declare it prophetically.

Examples of declaration:

"I believe that we serve a good God and He wants to give us a great life. I believe we are blessed to be a blessing to others." (Genesis 12:1-3; John 10:10)

"God has a wonderful plan to give us a great future. My future is bright and filled with hope." (Jeremiah 29:11)



## **Divine Health and Healing**

We believe that being saved does not only refer to 'going to heaven' but it encompasses all aspects of life including the power to walk in divine health and the power to receive healing for our sick bodies and souls.

(Romans 8:11) "But if the Spirit of Him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, He who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through His Spirit who dwells in you."

The Bible tells us that Jesus focused His ministry on teaching, healing and setting people free from demonic bondages. We believe that healing is one of the primary areas where God's power can be evidently demonstrated to unbelievers to bring them to salvation and knowledge of God.

When God delivered the Israelites out of Egypt, He kept them in divine health despite the harsh conditions of the wilderness. He also brought them out with silver and gold, and there was none feeble among His tribes. (Psalm 105:37)

## **vangelism as a way of life**

The church exists to win the lost. Jesus gave this paramount commission to His church just before He returned to heaven.

(Matthew 28:19-20) "Therefore, go and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Teach these new disciples to obey all the commands I have given you. And be sure of this: I am with you always, even to the end of the age."

Over the last year or so, our church has encouraged our members to 'win one more for Jesus' and 'Walk across the room'. Cell groups are encouraged to hold Matthew parties where fellowship meals or outings are used to connect with pre-Christians. Every church member has an 'Oikos' which includes friends or relatives that they are in contact with. While cell groups are important to encourage and disciple one another in their walk with God, cell members are exhorted to continue their relationships with their 'Oikos' so that they can be won to the Lord in due time.

## **F**inancial blessing

(3 John 2) "Beloved, I pray that you may prosper in all things and be in health, just as your soul prospers."

It is our belief that God desires to bless His children in every aspect of their lives and that includes prosperity in our financial area. Besides removing the curse of sin and sickness, Jesus also removed the curse of poverty from us.

(Psalm 105:37) "He also brought them out with silver and gold, and there was none feeble among His tribes."

The Bible has many examples of God blessing His people materially and financially when they walk with God and are generous in their giving.





