She has been working tirelessly over the last thirteen years in establishing, connecting and training with our Karnataka field representatives, Pastor Jose and Pastor Jyothi.

Rev Jeremiah Yap and I had also deliberated and strategized on the continuing impact of NLRC planting churches to 'Bless the Nations' and reach the unreached people groups with the gospel of truth and freedom – in this context, the Kannadiga people totalling some 45 million in India.

This issue is dedicated to give a brief introduction of the six new pastors-evangelists, who are leading four new churches – NLRC Devanahalli, NLRC Tumkur, NLRC Holenarsipura and NLRC Golahalli in the Indian state of Karnataka. They are now integral to the family of NLRC group of churches.

MISSIONS IN KARNATAKA

Extract from Report by Pastor Jose Thomas

Pastor Jose Thomas' ministry in Karnataka began in 2001. He identified a group of people who are rejected by society and have not heard the gospel. These are the "Dalits" – people ostracized by society in the Indian caste system.

The ministry started in slums and villages with open-air evangelistic, preaching, teaching meetings. With the help of local churches, faithful brothers and sisters went into villages sharing



powerful testimonies. Moving in the anointing of the Holy Spirit, they witnessed many cases of healing and deliverance. Many people were convicted and came to Christ. Local pastors were designated to do follow-up and

visitations. At their request, training of pastors, leaders, women and youth were conducted.

The ministries grew and more new believers were added to the fellowship. Small churches were started. Small pieces of land were bought and churches constructed.

Approaches to Ministry

Village Ministry

Evangelistic gospel meetings, screening "The Jesus Film" (1) in local languages, medical clinics when there were doctors in the team. In towns and surrounding villages in Davangeri, Hosadurga, Tumkur, Devanahalli, Kolar, Bangarapet, Chickballapur.

Children's Ministry

Hostel for orphans – training for spiritual growth

Women's Ministry

Equip women in ministry prayer groups, fasting, educating women in family life, women's conference

Youth Ministry

Youth conferences for college students

Pastoral Ministry

Teaching and training seminars for pastors and church leaders. Pastors' conferences for different denominations and institutes to focus on unity and to build God's Kingdom minded people

Future Challenges

- Reaching the unreached areas with the Gospel. Visit villages and teach them to grow in the Lord
- Youth to equip them in the Word and disciplined lifestyle on God's principles
- Village women educating and training self help groups
- Widows help those who are neglected; especially the young widows with little children, who have lost their alcoholic husbands
